1. Opening Business

2. Student Achievement

- a. MAP Data-MAP has been completed for each student in our school. Angie will give the results of each homeroom teacher's class to SBDM council at next month's SBDM meeting. She stated some students seem to have a good foundation of specific skills. These students are self-motivated and know the right questions to ask. There are barriers in math and there seems to be no solid foundation of number sense in K-5. For example, the lack of knowledge in place value causes students to not understand other things. We, as a school, are going to concentrate more on looking at this data in order to drive instruction.
- b. Student Interventions-Emily Borders has been hired as a math interventionist, and she will work 100 days with 3rd-5th grade students. Emily will pull out students in 3rd grade and will push into 4th and 5th grade classrooms. She will begin her 100 days after fall break. Sonya Zielke began the school year as a math interventionist, and she is using Snap as an assessment tool for K-1 students and targeted 2nd and 3rd grade students. She just received VMATH to guide instruction for RTI Tier 3 students in grades 2-5. When Sharon Bratcher and Beth Crowe finish their work in the library and with technology glitches, they both will begin working with students in grades K-2 in the area of math and will pull small groups from descartes. If time permits, Angie said Beth may work with literacy intervention students and assist Michelle Simpson.
